



On 18 May 2016, in the movie theatre "Tuskanac" in Zagreb, the film "Aristophanes in Dnopolje" by Natasa Milojevic was screened, along with the staging of an exhibition of female portraits titled "For me to be me" and an exhibition of organic products and hand-woven items made by women's associations from Licko Petrovo Selo, Gracac and Korenica.

The film "Aristophanes in Dnopolje" is about women returnees to Croatia and the day-to-day challenges faced in the towns and villages of the Lika region.
