

The seventh "Month of Serbian Culture in Hungary" was officially inaugurated in Deszk, a border town situated on the tripoint between Serbia, Hungary and Romania, on 10 September 2016.

Ambassador of the Republic of Serbia in Budapest Rade Drobac praised the fact that, for the first time, the event had been taking place outside Budapest, highlighting that culture was a significant factor of preserving a people's identity, and the best bridge for establishing cooperation with other nations.
