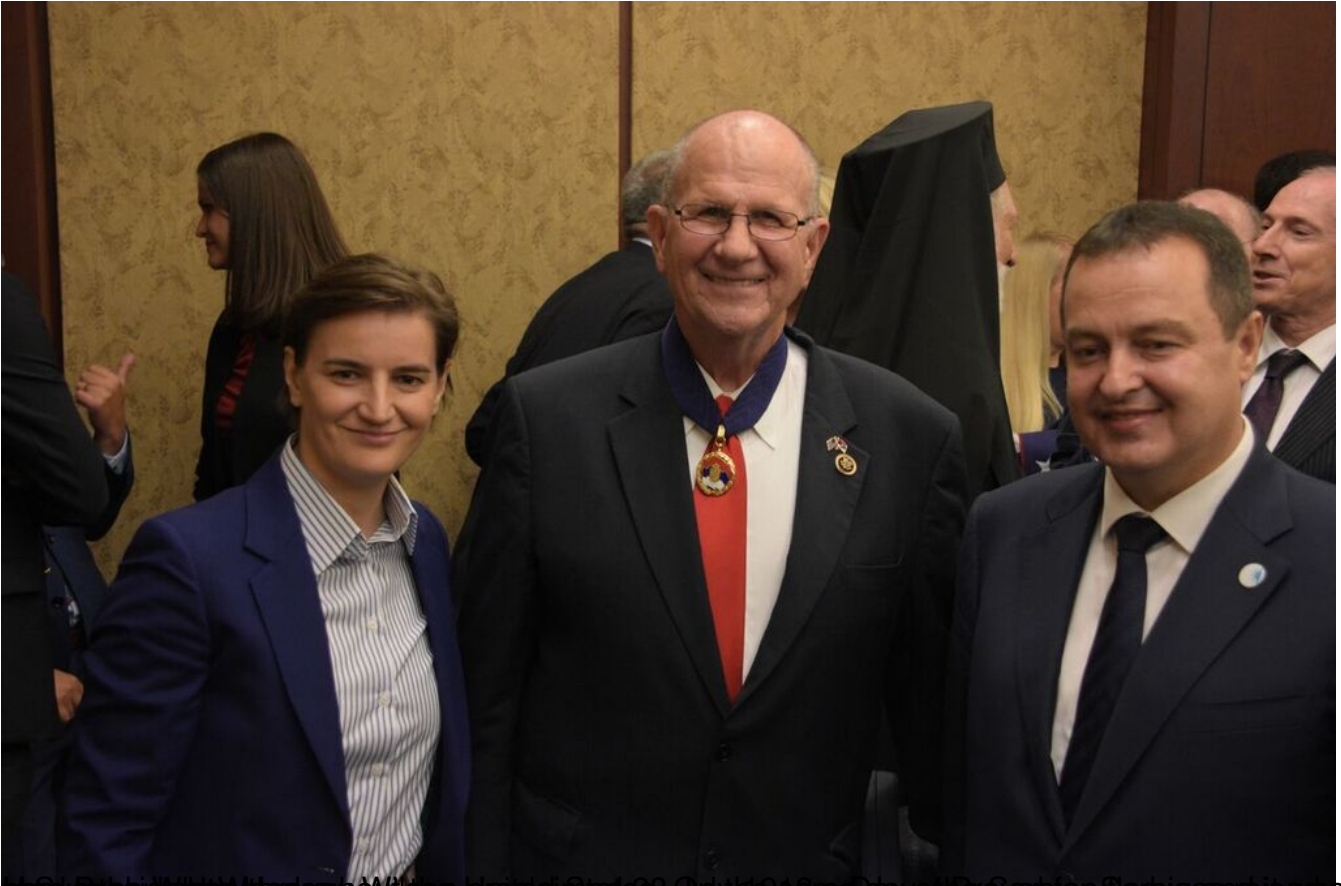


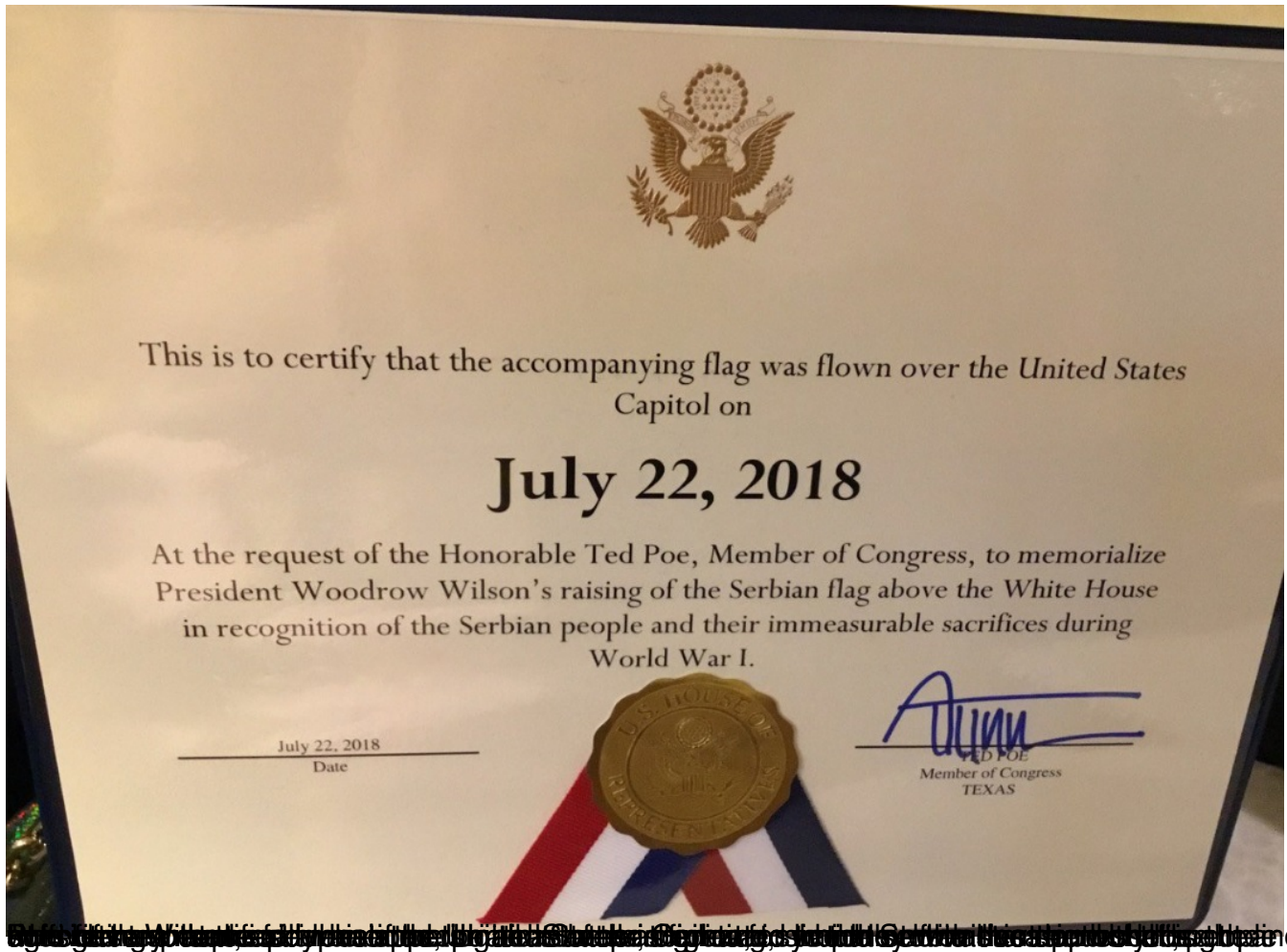


Embassy of Serbia, Serbian Caucus and Serbian Orthodox Diocese of Eastern America on 25 July organized a reception in the Congress on the occasion of the 100th anniversary since President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed a Day of Prayer for Serbia and when the Serbian flag flew over the White House.

In addition to Prime Minister Ana Brnabic, Minister of Foreign Affairs Ivica Dacic and Prime Minister of Republika Srpska Zeljka Cvijanovic, the reception was attended by many guests from political and public life, U.S. Administration representatives, Congressional offices and Committees, diplomatic and military corps and Serbian community in the United States. Prime Minister Brnabic addressed the guests as well as Episcopope Irinej of the Serbian Orthodox Diocese of Eastern America, Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Defense Laura Cooper, head of the Senate Foreign Relations Subcommittee on Europe and Regional Security Cooperation Ron Johnson and Co-Chairman of the Serbian caucus Congressman Ted Poe. On that day, Episcopope Irinej opened the session of the U.S. House of Representatives by a prayer.
